ARTISTIC PROCESS

STEVE KURTH: My original intent for this new G.I. Joe book was to ink all of the figures myself and pencil the backgrounds. I do my fair share of inked commissions and figured I could handle all the character work and things would truck right along.

This turns out was a lie my brain was telling me right to my face. The two inked pages not only took much longer than I'd anticipated but I just didn't think the ink work was up to snuff. I think doing an issue or two of pages this way would have got me to where I wanted to be with the quality and speed, but I didn't want to use a #1 issue, a relaunch of a book, as a place to start teaching myself how to not suck at something.

Also, I wasn't in love with the storytelling of the two pages either.

With page one, I very much liked the guy in the first panel, and thought the storytelling was okay in the following panels, but when we get to the last panel, and the big reveal is that COBRA is back, and they re pulling a UN deal, it felt kind of blah to me. A nice enough panel but it wasn't hitting me. That's why in the second version of the page I ended the page with a big COBRA logo. I wanted it to have a little more weight and impact.

With the second page the storytelling was okay, but I want finding our introduction to the older lease to be all that interesting. Every time we see a character for the first time in a book I want to give them some room to breather. I want them to have a bear where we let them soak in. Sometimes I don't have the room to do that, but with Isaac I really wanted that shot because in a cool twisty way, the's the here of this particular story. He's not the good guy but he's the center of attention and you want to feel that when you see him for the first time. With the second version I think it's more successful that way. In the original he's just kind of a dude plopped on a page who looks sour the last two panels.
